The aim of the course is to form students' scientific worldview and a system of guidelines for learning about the principles of comparative criminal law, the grounds of criminal liability and general features of criminal offense (CP), the characteristics of individual CP, the rules of their qualification, separation of , system, types of criminal penalties, grounds and procedure for sentencing, conditions of release from criminal liability, repayment and removal of convictions. <b>The discipline "Comparative Criminal Law"</b> is aimed at providing students with knowledge of: general principles of qualification of criminal offenses; elements of the composition of criminal offenses; tends in the development of criminal legislation of Ukraine, the state of judicial practice; system and types of criminal penalties, conditions and procedure for their application; types of individual criminal offenses, and their composition; processes of legal support of the main types of legal and international economic cooperation. The purpose of the educational component: the formation of students' thorough knowledge of comparative criminal law as a branch of law and skills to qualify socially dangerous acts, mastering the provisions on sentencing, as well as developing skills of independent qualification of criminal offenses, defining the main objects of criminal law protection in the system of public relations, as well as trends in the optimization of criminal law related to the factors of social conditionality of socially dangerous acts and the transformation of the structure of public relations. The discipline " <b>Comparative</b>
		<b>Criminal Law</b> " is designed to form students' legal awareness and legal culture, the study of criminal law systems from around the world, with the direct aim of stimulating comparisons and discussions.
