





Module description	<p>Course “History of State and Law of Ukraine and the Foreign Countries” focuses on studying the process of formation, development and changes of structures, institutions and mechanisms of government from ancient period till now. This course focuses student’s attention on development of the foreign legal systems, including certain codifications and legal acts.</p> <p>Tasks: to form in the students the results of the learning in the discipline which will ensure the achievement of the relevant program learning outcomes after the completion of the educational program. In particular, the educational component “History of State and Law of Ukraine and the Foreign Countries” forms a block of knowledge, skills and competencies necessary for the use of systematic knowledge in the field of law. Provide students with knowledge of the general history of state and law of Ukraine and the foreign countries, to highlight</p>			

		historical ways of formation and development of the political and legal structure of the leading countries of the world in different historical epochs and periods of time.
